## Silver \& Blue Sees Red Against Tru Green to Get in the Black

## The Cowboys, George Pierce, 10/8/03, 8:00pm

Wednesday night The Cowboys played a team we'd never faced, called Tru Green. We sat at 3-3 and this was our chance to climbed over 0.500 and be on the positive side of things. We won the coin toss and elected Home Team.

McCoy punched a gap on the right side for an inside-the-park homer and we quickly led 9-2! A line-out to first ended the inning, but we'd hit the ball well as even our outs were hit hard.

Tru Green put up another run in the third, but we answered with a deuce, 11-3, on three straight singles and three straight flies. In the fourth we handed Green a donut and went to work again. We started our half of the fourth with a ground-out, then got three singles and a walk for a pair of runs, 13-3, a fielder's-choice gave us two down, then Gregg "the Bunny" Brooke smacked a double for a two-out run and we led 14-3! Robbie Crider "Shade of Pale" ** followed that with a triple for two more runs, 16-3, and Russell "Shades of" Ray drove him in with a two-out single and the lead was 173! A double followed and we were a hit away from winning! Howard "Judge" Mathis delivered the hit, a single for two runs, and we won the game, by run-rule, 19-3!

Thursday night the Dirty Dozen had a rain makeup against DSGB, a team we'd played once before, winning 12-5 in Summer 2003. They are a bunch of young guys with quick feet and hands, but not a lot of punch. They look like they probably played baseball in school and are now learning to play Softball.
Thursday happens to be the day the Mixed Nuts play, but there was no conflict, since the Dirty Dozen played at 7:30 at Bethesda and the Nuts played at 9:45 at Lanford Park, only 15 minutes away. The Dozen wound up on a Thursday instead of a Saturday, because Field 9 was open on Thursdays. It's a coed night at Bethesda and only two leagues filled up, leaving Field 9 open. It was weird timing, but we were also very lucky as we could play one game and drive comfortably to the other park to play the second. We lost the coin toss (after three straight wins, I might add) and were Visitors.

We came out hitting in the first inning and put two guys on base out of the first three batters, then Larry "Darrell \& Darrell" Civelli smacked a single and it was 1-0. A walk loaded the bags and a single and double unloaded them and we led 4-0, but petered out after that. DSGB threw a run on the board in the first to make it 4-1. In the second we led off with a line-out and a double and Russell " $X$ " Ray tripled for a run and we led $5-1$. A single scored Russ, $6-1$, but the runner stretched the single into an out and we had two down. A ground-out ended the rally and we changed sides. DSGB put up a deuce, 6-3, and they were staying close like the other time we played them.
We got two in the third, 8-3, the second run on a two-out, RBI single from Robbie "the Robot" Crider, but DSGB answered our two with two of their own and it was still close at $8-5$ after three innings. We pounded out a bunch of singles and doubles in the top of the fourth and scored six much needed runs, 14-5. The last run scored on a two-out singled from Jeff "J-Dub" Whitley. We batted eleven times in the inning and hit the ball well, despite a B.O.O.B. for the first out. Our guy ran to first base and the first baseman caught a bad, high throw and when he landed he touched the orange safety bag. It was very obvious he'd done it, but before I could get an appeal our runner had left the field, so he was out and there could be no appeal. That's a good lesson, y'all. The first baseman is not allowed to touch that orange safety bag during a play. If our guy had stayed on the white bag after the play, I could have appealed and won (I asked both umpires later and they would have called our guy "safe".) and we might have still been batting in the top of the fourth inning. DSGB put a run on the board in the fourth and we'd built a little breathing room at 14-6.

In the fifth inning we kept right on hitting where we'd left off in the fourth. The first eight batters pounded out six runs, 20-6, with only one out, then "Mutt \&" Jeff Whitley crushed one to the fence for a triple and it was 21-6! A single made it 22-6 and a fly gave us two down, then Shane "Captain James T." Kirkland roped a two-out single and we led 23-6 before a final ground-out ended the fun. We batted thirteen times that inning, scoring nine runs and Shane Kirkland was 2-2 in the inning. It was do-or-die time for DSGB as they needed six runs in the bottom of the fifth to stay in the ball game. The clock was probably ticking so loudly that even if they scored six or more they would lose as soon as the clock stopped. We changed pitchers in the crucial bottom of the fifth and Russell "Nolan" Ray came in from the bull pen. We put 'em down 1-2-3-4 for a donut and won the game 23-6!
