Walking Dead, Bethesda, 10/19/15, 6:30pm

We batted fourteen times in the inning and **Tim McCoy** was 2-2 in the inning. I told you it was a different story. **The Hammy's** bowed up in the fourth inning as well and scored four runs to cut our lead to 12-6.

We only managed one run in the sixth inning as the storyline changed again, the run scoring on a two-out single from **Larry Civelli "Vanilli"**. **The Hammy's** failed to score and it was 13-6 after sixth. There wasn't much time left on the clock when **The Hammy's** made the last out in the sixth, so we went to the seventh trying to put up a couple of insurance runs, but also to see who would make the final out and take him a trophy.

With the game well in hand, the story Monday night change to one of trying very hard not to make that last out of 2015. We led off with a pair of doubles then both runners scored on a single and those first three hitters figured they were safe from the Horse. Two more singles loaded the sacks and a walk made it 16-6, the back-to-back doubles drove in four more runs and we led 20-6 and suddenly the guys who'd made the final out in the sixth was right back in the cross hairs. A ground-out gave us one down and a single followed to drive in a run. A single put a second man on base and another made it 22-6, before a fielder's-choice gave us two down and the rest of the hitters were white knuckling. "Slim" **Tim McCoy** was the first to step into the fire and singled home a run. "Seldom" **Elden Kasmier** was next and also drove in a run with a base hit. **Mark "Twain" Irwin** followed with a double then **Jason Tyler** grounded-out to end the inning. We batted seventeen times in the seventh, scoring twelve runs and built up a 25-6 lead. **Brett Shumaker, Tim McCoy, Elden Kasmier** and **Mark Irwin** were each 2-2 in the inning. **The Hammy's** needed nineteen runs to stay alive and not even JT could boot enough balls to force and eighth inning and avoid the wrath of the Horse. We shutout **The Hammy's** in the seventh and won the game 25-6.


They kicked us hard amongst the tail feathers.







Bat Certification Testing



From now on Gwinnett County Parks and Recreation will use a new procedure for certifying Softball bats used at Bethesda, George Pierce and Best Friend Parks.

Before a bat can be used in a game it must be tested to verify that it conforms to ASA guidelines regarding compression.

It's a simple test. The barrel of the bat is placed into a fixture to steady the bat and position it at the proper location on the barrel. The handle rests on a pad to hold the bat level. A gauge with a dial is screwed down onto the barrel of the bat. This does not damage the bat and only takes 20-30 seconds.

If the reading on the dial shows a legal bat then the person testing the bat will affix an orange sticker (pictured on the left) just above the tape on the handle.

If a bat fails, it's no problem, but no sticker, either.

To use a bat in a Gwinnett park you need the sticker, regardless of the manufacturer's stamp, or list of bats on a website, or a note from your Mom or the Pope, or any other form of verification. No sticker, no bat.

Bat testing will begin before the first game every night and end sometime before the first game starts. Bats may also be tested at the GCPR office during regular business hours as long as you make an appointment.

Any player using an illegal (non stickered) bat will be called out. If a player steps in the batter's box with a non certified bat, he's called out. If he gets a hit with that bat and somebody notices after the fact, he's out.

All bats must be tested before the first game of every new season.
