## Mixed Nuts Begin Fall PST

Thursday night saw the final Mixed Nuts game of 2003. We just didn't know when, yet. We were top seed in the Fall Post Season Tournament and it was single-elimination, meaning the losers went home as soon as they lost one game. Our first game was at 7:35 and the winner of that game played at 9:45. We hoped and suspected we'd be playing that 9:45 game, but we weren't about to start counting chickens before anything hatched.
Our first opponent would be the winner of a 6:30 game that pitted St. Edwards, the \#4 seed, against Briarlake Baptist at \#5. As the top seed in the seven team tournament we had a Bye in the first round and went right to the semifinals. On the other side of the bracket, Calvary forfeited (not enough women) to Atlanta Connection at 6:30, so AC advanced to the semifinals. We wanted St. Edwards to win their game so we could beat them again. We beat them the first game of the first game of the season then lost to them, in a game where we didn't hit, for our only loss, so we wanted them again. Briarlake waffled St. Ed sending them to play us at 7:35. While we played our first game, Embry Hills, \#2, their only loss to the Mixed Nuts, would play Loose Change, \#7, to advance to play Atlanta Connection.
We'd played Briarlake twice during the season, winning 26-11 the second game of the season and 16-12 in the first game of a double-header the seventh week. Briarlake is the team whose third baseman wanted their pitcher to break Howard Mathis' nose the first time we played them. (We still dunno why she did it...) In the fourth inning we put the six Nuts on base, scoring four runs, 12-7, before we made the first out. The next three batters plated three more, 15-7, but a bang-bang double-play ended the fun. Our long rally had burned a lot of clock and those insurance runs we much appreciated. They came in handy, too, as Briarlake pumped three runs on the board, but the clock was dead and we won 15-10!

## Big Bambino Brings Big Bat to Big Game

We had played Embry Hills only once before, in the sixth week of the season. We had just come off our only loss, to St. Edwards, and stood at 4-1. We knew we hadn't hit against St. Ed and were ready to tear somebody up and Embry Hills and their 5-0 record came next on the schedule. We led them the whole game and won 16-11 in a game that featured a lot of clutch hitting and slick fielding from both teams.
We won the coin toss and hit the field and our defense looked great as we stopped Embry Hills cold on three hard hit balls. We almost suffered a similar first inning fate as we led off with a line-out and fly-out, but we followed with two singles to keep the inning alive. Tim "MAY!" McCoy delivered a third straight single and we were on the board, 1-0! A fourth single loaded the bases, then Jeff "J-Dub" Whitley busted a two-out, two-run double and we led 3-0, but a groundout ended the inning. Embry plated a pair in the second and we answered with one on a couple of singles and a walk and led 4-2. Embry Hills took the lead in the third with a four spot on some good hitting and led 6-4. We got a run back when Tim "tation" McCoy drove in a one-out single on a triple, 6-5.
In the top of the fourth we put the leather to Embry Hills and held them to nothing, and in the bottom of the fourth we got our bats going again. A single and double led us off and a walk loaded the bags for Rock "the Kasbah" McCoy **, who busted a single, two runs scored and we led 7-6! The next four Nuts singled for three more runs, 10-6, a bases loaded fly made it 11-6, then Tim "ber!" McCoy roasted RCF for a triple and we led 13-6! A single plated the fourteenth run, but two straight flies ended the inning. We batted thirteen times that inning, scoring nine to change a 6-5 deficit into a 14-6 lead!
Now, Embry Hills didn't get to the PST Championship game by laying down whenever their opponent put some runs on the board and Thursday night was no exception as they came back hard in the top of the fifth. They had their backs to the wall and got fired up, scoring six runs to close the gap to 14-12. In the bottom of five we led off with a single and another single followed, but the batter B.O.O.B.ed trying for a double for the first out. A fly made it 15-12 and the next batter ended the inning. Embry got a run in the top of six and we got it back on a leadoff single and a triple from "Bad Baby" Amy Parham and it was 16-13 going into the final inning.
With a three run lead and one inning to go, we felt good that our defense had been playing well, but Embry Hills' offense had been playing well, too... In the top of the seventh inning they put their first two runners aboard on a single and a walk, then one of their big guys busted one over the fence for a three-run tater and, just like that, it was 16-16. After that we got three of them out, but one more run trickled in and we trailed 17-16 Now it was time for us to knuckle down with one chance left. In the bottom seven, "Calico" Cat Butler led off with a single and we had the tying run aboard. Next up was Jeff "Bambino" Whitley, who looked at one pitch then ripped the second way over the LCF fence for a two-run, walk off homer and we won the game and the Championship 18-17!!!!! That ball was gone as soon as it touched Jeff's bat!
