## Jets Show Who's Who

## The Jets, Lucky Shoals, 10/24/03, 8:00pm

The last time The Jets played we played ViaSat, a team that we'd beaten twice last Tundraball and again earlier this season. We almost lost that last one as we scored three runs in the top of the first inning and trailed 11-3 after five. We rallied for an eleven-spot in the top of six, but ViaSat scored three in the bottom half as time ran out and we were tied 1414. The seventh was an extra inning and we failed to score. Our defense handed ViaSat only their second donut of the game in the bottom of seven and we went to the eighth. We rallied for another eleven-spot in the top of eight and gave ViaSat another goose egg for a 25-14 win. So, when we played ViaSat this last time we hoped to show them that we could score plenty of runs early in a game and keep on scoring.
We were Visitors after a coin landed awry and grabbed our bats, planning to do some early damage. We did. We led off with a double and a single, then Tim "MAY!" McCoy put us on the board, 1-0, with a double. A single plated a pair, 30 and a fly gave us one down. Back-to-back singles made it 4-0, a fielder's-choice made it two down, then Freddy "Krueger" Allen busted a deep one for a three-run, inside-the-park homer and we led 7-0! We got a single and double next, but a fly ended the rally. All twelve of us batted in the first and proved that we could score a few early runs on ViaSat. They proved they could still keep up with us and in the bottom of one they threw four runs on the board.
Now, we weren't about to go flat against ViaSat again, so we put up a few more in the second inning. We piled on six more runs, 13-4, on singles and doubles and hit the field to see if ViaSat could hang with us. They got zip in the second inning. Last Monday the Dirty Dozen played Luby's II for essentially all the marbles. We were 5-2 and looking up at Luby's 61. They had already beaten us by two runs the first week of the season, so if we beat them by three or more, we'd be the top dog by tie-breaker. A loss, of course would blow us out of contention for the top spot. In a make-or-break game like that there's no Men's team l'd rather be playing with than the Dirty Dozen. We've been in lots of big games and knew what to do.

Wednesday night The Cowboys played B.O.B. for the second time. The first time hadn't been any fun as we lost 20-8. Our defense fell apart in the bottom of the first and B.O.B. put up nine and just kept rolling with five in the second and five more in the third. They were pretty smug and ran their mouth just a little towards the end of that game, so this meeting was another in a series of payback games.
We played the very last game of the season at 10:00pm, so we knew where everybody else had finished. Injoy won the league with a 9-1 record and the Derby \#10 had clinched second at 8-2. The Godfathers stood at 6-4 and the rest would finish below us, win or lose. So, The Cowboys and B.O.B. both stood at 5-4. A Cowboy win would give us third place over the Godfathers, by tie-breaker and a loss would drop us to fifth. B.O.B. would finish fifth if we finished third and vice versa. A fly made it two down and the pressure was on! Russell Ray was next and grounded-out, second to first to end the inning and earn some iron. Okay, if B.O.B. scored 17 in the bottom of the inning, we'd have to bat again and all bets would be off, but I'm gonna let you in on a little secret, here: They didn't. They put up four runs, but we won the game 23-10. Russell Ray ended the game on a ground-out, second to first. That was a good game to end 2003. We beat B.O.B. by thirteen, where they beaten us by twelve, and we silenced their little bit of yapping from the game before. Robbie Crider won the Batting Title with an 0.892 and Norman Mapp came in second with a cool 0.759. Tim McCoy finished above the team average of 0.649 with a 0.688 and Howard Mathis was right on the bubble with a 0.649 .

Robbie's 0.892 average gave him a new McCoy Softball record for highest average batting average ever on a Men's team. The old record was 0.824 and has stood since Tundraball 1993 at the Softball Country Club. Back then Batting Titles were based on On Base Percentage, but Tim McCoy didn't walk that season, so his 0.824 was the biggest batting average until Robbie knocked him off this season. The highest ever Cowboys record was 0.778 by Tom Frier in Summer I 1996 at the SCC. They's a new gun slinger on The Cowboys, y'all,... and his name is Robbie Crider!

Russell Ray joins Tim McCoy as the only two players, so far, to make Fatal Final Outs for 2003. Tim made his in the Mixed Nuts last 2003 game in the bottom of the seventh inning of the PST Championship game with a lead. Embry Hills took the lead in the top of seven, but a single and a walkoff homer won the game, leaving Tim on the bubble.
